On April 9th, Hanamatsuri is scheduled at the Buddhist Church of Florin. We will have a guest speaker, Sensei Koichi Mizushima from the Sacramento Betsuin. Hanamatsuri is a day to celebrate the birth of Shakyamuni Buddha. It is said that when Shakyamuni Buddha was born, the sky was delighted, sweet rain fell, the ground received the rain and beautiful flowers bloomed. This is the origin of the ritual of pouring sweet tea on the statue of the little Shakyamuni Buddha. We look forward to celebrating Shakyamuni Buddha's birthday with you.

The Sambujo that we always recite at the beginning of our service, is a request to "welcome Buddha to the Hondo". There is a part in the sutra that reads SANGE, which means to scatter flowers. Since ancient times, flowers have been one of the major donations in Buddhism.

In the Amida Kyo Sutra, it is said that the various colors of flowers are blooming dignifiedly, showing off their own colors in the Pure Land. No two flowers have the same color, but Amida Buddha's light reaches all flowers.

The depiction of the Pure Land written in Amida-kyō Sutra reads:

"Again, Shariputra, in that world there are lotus ponds whose shores are decorated with seven kinds of jewels. The ponds brim with waters of eight good qualities and the floor of the ponds are lined with sand of gold. The ponds are surrounded by steps on their four sides made of gold, silver, lapis lazuli, and crystal. Above, are pavilions lavishly adorned with the seven jewels of gold, silver, lapis lazuli, crystal, coral, red pearls, and agate. There are lotuses blooming in the ponds, and their flowers are as large as the wheel of a cart. The blue flowers emit a blue light; the yellow flowers emit a yellow light; the red flowers emit a red light; and the white flowers emit a white light. Each of the lotus flowers glows, weaving a harmonic scene while emitting a subtle fragrance. Shariputra, this land of Ultimate Bliss, is an ideal environment, so that whatever people lay their eyes upon will bring about awakening."

It is said that when people are born into the Pure Land, each person will be born from the lotus flower from the Pure Land's pond. The passage shared at the beginning tells about the lotus flowers that bloom in the Pure Land of Amida Buddha. The phrase "the blue flowers emit a blue light; the yellow flowers emit a yellow light..." tells us that each of us already have our own color that is shining. We can see that everyone is different and everyone is precious. Each person has their own previous life and it will not be compared to anyone else'. People may think that having something that is superior to others is a condition for living brilliantly. Everyone is desperately struggling to get something better than others. However, we all have strengths and weaknesses. All human beings have a finite existence. In the limited time we have, even if we look for something excellent in ourselves that no one else has, it is just a comparison. From the Buddha's point of view, everyone is at the same level and equal. The true meaning of shining brightly frees us from wanting to compare ourselves with others. We, who receive the warm light of Amida Buddha, are all equal and equally brilliant and wonderful.

Beams of light, thirty-six hundred Thousand billion in number, Shine brilliantly from within each flower; There is no place they do not reach. [Shinran Shonin]

Hanamatsuri (Buddha's Birthday)

Some of text on this page comes from a pamphlet published by the Northwest Ministerial Association, Buddhist Churches of America.

Hanamatsuri, literally means "Flower Festival." It is celebrated on April 8, commemorating the birth of Siddhartha Gautama. Siddhartha became enlightened as Shakyamuni Buddha, marking the release of sentient beings from suffering and sorrow.

According to our tradition, the historical Buddha, Sakyamuni, was born in Lumbini Garden in Nepal on April 8, 566 B. C. He was born the son of King Suddohana and Queen Maya. There are many flowery descriptions of the scene at his birth, including celestial birds singing beautiful songs, beautiful flowers, and a sweet gentle rain bathing the baby Buddha. It is not necessarily the beauty of the flowers, the sounds of the celestial birds nor the sweet gentle rain that fell, but the vibrant fact that on this day was born the greatest of sentient beings who became the Enlightened One, the Buddha.

During the Hanamatsuri Service a flower shrine, known as Hanamido, is set up in front of the main shrine as a symbol of Lumbini Garden. A statuette of the infant Buddha is placed in the shrine and the congregation offer flowers and pours sweet tea over the statuette. According to the ancient legend, the universe was filled with joyful music, flowers bloomed in full glory and the heavens were overjoyed with the birth causing a sweet rain to bathe the infant.

Kyudo Kai of Florin

Kyudo, an ancient martial art of Japan is now being taught at the Buddhist Church of Florin (BCF). Approved by the BCF board in the spring of 2022, the first class of the Kyudo Kai of Florin (KKF) started in November of 2022. KKF is a non-profit organization that strives to provide education, training and cultural awareness of kyudo in the Florin community.

Kyudo means "way of the bow" and is considered to be one of the oldest traditional martial arts in Japan. The earliest known development of Japanese archery dates back to 7,000 BC.

Rich with history, kyudo has evolved in its use from early period hunting, to weapons of war to ceremonial purposes. Although not a religion, kyudo was influenced by two major schools of religious thought: Shinto and Chinese Zen.

Modern Kyudo is not simply viewed as a means to shoot at a target; but rather, the focus is to develop the inner spirit, respect for others and harmony in the learning environment.

The KKF mon was designed to recognize kyudo in the Florin community. Created by Sacramento graphic designer, Doreen Hosokawa, the strawberry leaves serve to remember the Japanese immigrants who settled in Florin to farm. In addition, there are 5 arrows that each represent the Buddhist Church of Florin, Kyudo Kai of Florin, Hawaii Kyudo Kai (our sister organization), our Japanese ancestors and the future cultural legacy that kyudo will bring to the Florin community. Pictured (below left) is Ai Oyama Sensei of HKK who provides remote instruction and advice to KKF.
