To Accept Everything That Happens As It Is. [Arinomama]

In Buddhism, the word "Shohōmuga" means "All existences are devoid of a permanent ego." Meaning, everything changes and there is no fixed entity. What we perceive to "exist" is looking at what just happened at that moment and has changed. "Shohōmuga" is the perception that they don't really exist. In fact, the existence of "oneself" that we recognize is also just a part of the work of the world and just happens. Despite this, suffering arises when things do not go as we planned because we try to separate "ourselves" from "this world."

In 1900-1982 there was a Buddhist minister Rev. Rijin Yasuda from Higashi-Hongwanji-Ha. He was a famous Japanese Buddhist scholar and has left many impressive phrases. For example: "Life never gets stuck, just our emotions get stuck.", "The voice is in the ear.", "Even if we say we got enlightened, we just enlightened that we are lost.", "It's easy to say good things. It's hard to say the truth.", "If you feel you have to do it, stop it. If you feel you can't stop yourself from doing it, just do it." etc.

One day, Rijin was unfortunately involved in an incident. The house next to him caught fire and also burned down his home. At that time, all his important books and notebooks were burnt. They were very important to him as a scholar. An ordinary person would be immeasurably distraught. However, he said: "It wasn't burned by anyone. It wasn't burned by me. It just burned. Then, I think I could accept this fact as it is. I don't have to hurt myself or others. I learned from this fire." When he received the facts in this way, his mind calmed down. He says he learned from this fire that "myself" is always the cause of suffering. If I were in his situation, I would find it difficult to stop the feelings of suffering such as sadness and anger.

Even though I know the perception of "Shohōmuga" means "All existences are devoid of permanent ego", I have always seen the world selfishly. I feel that his story teaches us the importance of knowing the cause of our suffering. Our daily lives change every day, but as a Buddhist, I would like to spend my days of Nembutsu while accepting what life is. Namo Amida Butsu
