This month, we will be observing Fall O-Higan which happens during the fall equinox, when the day and night are the same amount of time. This balance is a signal to us to reevaluate the balance in our life and reflect on our recommitment to the Buddhist teachings. Higan is translated as "other shore" meaning that we are on the ocean of life-and-death, coming from the shore of ignorance and heading towards the other shore of nirvana.

As Jodo Shinshu Buddhists, we don't believe that we can attain enlightenment in this life. We are too possessed of worldly passions and ego-self that we are unable to let go of the material things that cause us suffering. However, this is not to say that we cannot benefit from the other shore before we get there. There is a metaphor in Buddhism of the "Middle Path" which is meant to teach us to stay away from extremes, such as eternalism (that everything has an unchanging self) and nihilism (that nothing actually exists) in order to understand the true reality of our existence. This is applied to many different concepts in Buddhism and life in order to help us strike an appropriate balance.

For this month, I'd like to focus on the Middle Path between our everyday world and the world of nirvana. To think that these are two different realms of existence would be mistaken. But, to think that they are also the same would be wrong as well. It gets quite confusing but suffice it to say that both are important, and you cannot have one without the other. In our everyday life, we must use words and ideas to get anything done. For instance, we use the term "car" to refer to the vehicle that takes us to work. If we were to disassemble our car look for what makes it a "car" we wouldn't be able to find anything. The true reality is that it is made up of different things that, when assembled a certain way, we attribute a "car-ness" to. But, when we need to tell someone that we're putting gas in the assortment of plastic and metal pieces that make up the vehicle that takes us to work, it's easier just to say "car".

Still, it is necessary for us to take the time to contemplate on the true reality of things. Although we may never achieve an unceasing realization of enlightenment, it isn't to say that enlightenment is not already all around us, calling to us. So, hopefully we quiet our minds for a second and listen to the call. It isn't the easy or even instinctual thing to do, but if we can try to "see" the Other Shore while we are on the way over, it can help make the journey smoother sailing.

Due to capacity issues, we ask that you please RSVP the number of people attending by Wednesday, September 21, 2022 to floring-buddhist@gmail.com if you plan to attend the service.

We will continue to follow safety protocols for all in-person services.

- Face masks must always be worn while indoors.
- Sanitize hands before entering the Hondo or other church facilities.
- Attend services only when you are healthy and free from symptoms.
- Continue to practice social distancing.
- Services will be held in the Hondo with seating properly spaced apart. Families may be seated together
 in specified sections. Families with children 5 years old and younger will have special reserved seating
 areas.

The Buddhist Church of Florin's Kikuyo and Kinjiro Nakatani Public School Teacher Grants are awarded to three deserving public school teachers. Each recipient receives a grant in the amount of \$1,500. The Kikuyo and Kinjiro Nakatani Public School Teacher Grant recipients are Stephanie Kuroda, Nadine Nouchi, and Kimiko Yamamoto Hayashida.

Stephanie Kuroda teaches 6th grade at Crocker Riverside Elementary School in the Sacramento City Unified School District. With the grant award, Stephanie plans to purchase classroom supplies for her students; plus, educational materials such as novels for reading groups, supplemental grammar and math materials, and science supplies for laboratory experiments.

Stephanie is a church member and granddaughter of Janet Kuroda.

Nadine Nouchi teaches 1st through 6th grade physical education at Theodore Judah Elementary School in the Sacramento City Unified School District. Nadine plans to purchase specialized physical education equipment for her special population students (moderate to severe autism), as well as non-traditional interactive equipment for all grades to use.

Nadine, husband Henry Lam, and daughter, Ella are church members.

Kimiko Yamamoto Hayashida teaches 7th, 8th, and 9th grades at Holmes Junior High School in the Davis Joint Unified School District. She plans to purchase mathematics and study skills supplies and educational materials for her students to be successful in school; including math materials for a special education class she co-teaches.

Kimiko, husband Mark Hayashida, and twin sons, Kai and Kenji are church members.

Unfortunately, public school teachers pay for classroom supplies and educational material with their own money because of school budget cuts. The Buddhist Church of Florin supports public school teachers by offering a \$1,500 grant for classroom supplies and education materials; and if necessary, for Personal Protection supplies and equipment.

To be eligible for the Kikuyo and Kinjiro Nakatani Public School Teacher Grant, you must be a full-time public school teacher in Kindergarten through 12th grade; and a member of the Buddhist Church of Florin (church membership dues are paid and current).
